PAL Meeting – sleep and memory 23rd March Christine Gilligan is our PAL representative and she attended the meeting with 2 other members. The speaker was Dr Penny Lewis from the school of Psychological Sciences at Manchester University. She gave an informative talk about the stages of sleep with the 'slow sleep stage' being linked to memory. Apparently the best time for this is one hour before midnight and 2 hours after.
