You will need to bring
Newspaper torn in 1x4 inches (2.5x10cm)
approximately
Stubby paint brush
Watertight container with a good seal
Vaseline
Apron

Saucer Kitchen paper

A roundish/curved shape with no sharp edges 4 to 10 inches (10 to 25 cm) - a bowl or similar. Could you make sure that you bring a shape that you can take home and not need immediately, as the papier maché will not be dry enough to move from the shape straight away.

If your shape is smaller your paper will have to be smaller as well.

Don't worry if you don't have everything Nicole will try to provide it.
